Learning to live after our mistakes

After a lame man was healed, people were astonished. Peter asks the crowds 'Why?' He explains that Jesus is the long-promised Messiah, rejected and killed but raised from the dead by God. And it is through Jesus that the man was healed. Citing Moses and the prophets, he calls the people to repent of their sins – including failing to recognise Jesus – and to know the refreshing presence of Jesus in their lives.

Failing is not always a bad thing; it can make us want to learn and improve. As Edison famously said about inventing the light bulb, 'I have not failed 10,000 times – I've successfully found 10,000 ways that will not work.' How do we respond to our mistakes? Do we learn to live better lives as a consequence?

give us such knowledge of his presence with us,
that we may be strengthened and sustained by his risen life
and serve you continually in righteousness and truth;

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

1 Answer me when I call to you, my righteous God. Give me relief from my distress; have mercy on me and hear my prayer.

2 **How long will you people turn my glory into shame?
How long will you love delusions and seek false gods?**

3 Know that the Lord has set apart his faithful servant for himself; the Lord hears when I call to him.

4 **Tremble and do not sin; when you are on your beds, search your hearts and be silent.**

5 Offer the sacrifices of the righteous and trust in the Lord.

6 **Many, Lord, are asking, "Who will bring us prosperity?" Let the light of your face shine on us.**

7 Fill my heart with joy when their grain and new wine abound.

8 **In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety.**
