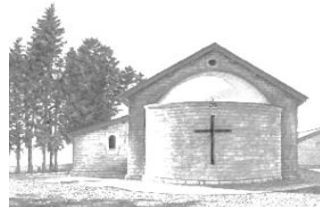

No borders

Mark 7.24-37

After healing and teaching in Jewish territory, Jesus moves to the Gentile region of Tyre and Sidon. There he encounters Gentiles in need of healing: full of hope, and faith in Jesus' healing ability, the people bring the needs of a sick girl and a deaf man to Jesus. Jesus heals them, then continues on his journey, urging the crowds to keep quiet about what he has done.

The readings explore how outsiders are included in our journey of faith. The Gentile woman and the disabled man are both people who were considered to be outsiders in Jesus' society. But there are no borders to God's love and welcome.

This week we explore being open and inclusive with others.
